We live in one of the most beautiful areas in the country.	
Why do people continue to litter our environment?	
Reasons often cited for "deliberate" littering include	
maliciousness, perversion, laziness, drinking and driving,	
lack of parental supervision, lack of education, and a large	
population that do not take pride in the community. In 2007	
one approach that Washington County had was to have a	
Litter Control program to combat illegal dumping that	
occurs on back roads, rural farm lands and abandoned	
properties, and to identify, document and develop cases	
against illegal dumpers in the county. In the code of	
Virginia
