A break-in of a residence in the southwestern section of Washington County, Virginia has resulted in the arrest of one individual and warrants being obtained for a second.

According to Washington County Sheriff Fred Newman, the break-in occurred on Hearst Road, Bristol, Virginia on Tuesday, February 8, 2011. "Deputies were in the area looking for a black over silver Dodge 4x4 pickup truck that was a suspect vehicle reportedly used in several daytime breaking and entering residences in the area. An alert citizen spotted the vehicle and immediately notified the Sheriff's Office," stated Sheriff Newman.

A BOLO was sent out and the pickup was spotted in Bristol, Tennessee, by Bristol Police Department and deputies with the Sullivan County Sheriff's Office. Property reported stolen in this recent break-in was located in a barn in which one of the parties had gone after exiting the vehicle, and prior to the arrival of the police.

Joshua Kenneth Hubbard, age 29, of 622 Piney Hill Road, Bristol, Tennessee was arrested as a result of the police action. He has been charged with breaking and entering, grand larceny, conspiring to break and enter and conspiring to commit grand larceny. Hubbard is being held in the Sullivan County Jail pending extradition to Washington County, Virginia.

Nicky Lynn Crumley, age 31, of 297 Summit Drive, Bluff City, Tennessee, who fled during the arrival of the police, is currently at large. Warrants have been obtained charging Crumley with breaking and entering, grand larceny, conspiracy to break and enter, and conspiracy to commit grand larceny.

Washington County Sheriff's Detective Lieutenant Byron Ashbrook and Detective Mike Martin investigated the incident with the assistance of other members of the Detective Division and members of the Patrol Division.
