REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about January 12, 2019, the County of Washington County will submit a request to the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Title 1 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (PL 93-383), as amended, to undertake a project known as Rattle Creek Water System Project, for the purpose of providing water to 12 households in the Rattle Creek area of Northwest Washington County.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

Washington County has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at Washington County Government Center Building, One Government Center Place, Abingdon, VA; on the Washington County website (washcova.com); and posted at Barnes Chapel Church, and may be examined or copied weekdays (8) A.M. to (5) P.M.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

Washington County certifies to DHCD that <u>Jason Berry</u> in <u>his</u> capacity as <u>County Administrator</u> consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. DHCD'S approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities, and allows Washington County to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

<u>DHCD</u> will consider objections to its release of funds and the <u>Washington County</u> certification received by January 11, 2018 or a period of fifteen days from its receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer or other officer of Washington County approved by DHCD; (b) Washington County has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the project have committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by DHCD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. The project will include the installation of approximately 6,000 LF of new water line as well as installation of all related appurtenances and 12 new service meters.
